1 **RESOLUTION #79-2015** 2 3 **GENERAL CODE OF ONEIDA COUNTY, WISCONSIN** 4 ORDINANCE AMENDMENT # 5 6 Ordinance Amendment offered by Forestry, Land and Recreation Committee 7 8 WHEREAS, Oneida County recreational facilities provide receptacles for waste 9 and recyclables for use by individuals recreating in said facilities; and 10 WHEREAS, the receptacles have been misused by persons disposing of 11 household and other miscellaneous garbage; and 12 WHEREAS, This increases costs of maintaining recreational facilities for the 13 intended purposes of said facilities. 14 NOW, THEREFORE, THE ONEIDA COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS 15 16 DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS: 17 18 Section 1. Any existing ordinances, codes, resolutions, or portions thereof in 19 conflict with this ordinance shall be and hereby are repealed as far as any conflict exists. 20 Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect the day after passage and publication 21 as required by law. 22 Section 3. If any claims, provisions or portions of this ordinance are adjudged 23 unconstitutional or invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, the 24 remainder of this ordinance shall not be affected thereby. 25 Section 4. Section 14.10 of the General Code of Oneida County, Wisconsin, is 26 amended as follows [additions noted by underline, deletions noted by strikethrough]: 27 28 14.10 (9) DISPOSAL OF REFUSE. (Am. Res. #93-2009) No person shall dispose of any 29 litter, garbage, sewage, bottles, tin cans, cigarette butts, paper or any other waste 30 material by dumping such refuse in any County recreation area, boat landing, 31 special use area, or forest land, except by placing said refuse in receptacles 32 provided for such purposes. Charcoal residue in any grill, fire-ring, or fireplace shall 33 be left in its place of origin until completely extinguished and cold. 34 Waste and recyclable receptacles provided in Oneida County recreational facilities 35 are only for refuse and recyclables generated by individuals while recreating in said 36 facilities.
