For the record, Chairman Cushing stated that the corrections on the October 19, 2010 minutes, on pages 5, 9, and page 12, passed unanimously.

Commence public hearing on the Oneida County 2011 proposed budget. Accept/consider comments and/or correspondence from the public and take whatever action is deemed necessary. Close public hearing and continue with agenda items.

Margie Sorenson, Finance Director, presented to the Board a brief summary of the 2011 Oneida County Budget. Ms Sorenson stated gross expense budgeted for 2011 is \$51,123,842. Total revenues are \$35,301,195 which is revenue plus the county sales tax. The 2011 proposed tax levy of \$15,493,648 is an increase of \$411,075 from the estimated 2010 property tax which is a 2.7 % increase in the levy. The tax rate \$2.12/\$1000 reflects an increase of 6.1% because equalized value went down for the second

year in a row. The levy limits have changed and Oneida County is \$1,673,510 million under the tax levy limit and \$6,213,701 million under the tax rate limit which was established in 1993.

Ms. Sorenson went on to briefly talk about the substantial increases in wages & fringes also an increase in health insurance and retirement and explained the Schedule of Personnel Changes to the Budget, along with the Schedule of Substantial Changes to Gross tax levy for 2011.

Public Comment on the 2011 County Budget:

Tri-County Council, Shellie Holmes and Lynn Feldman – are requesting that the County Board reject the Finance and Insurance Committee recommendation to cut 100% (\$15,000) in funding for Tri-County.

WHEREAS, the revenue from said mineral exploration leases was deposited into a segregated non-lapsing account referred to as the Mineral Resources Account; and

WHEREAS, Oneida County Board Supervisors designated that funds deposited in the Mineral Resources Account should be used on expenditures that benefit future generations; and

WHEREAS, the mineral exploration done in Oneida County between 1989 and the early 1990's resulted in a valuable ore deposit being located beneath County Forest Land located in the Town of Lynne; and

WHEREAS, the Lynne Town Board of Supervisors believe that as a result of the ore body being discovered within their town, their infrastructure, businesses, and the general quality of life of their residents have been and will continue to be disrupted more by mineral exploration and mining than any other area within Oneida County; and

WHEREAS, the Supervisors of the Town of Lynne are aware of the history of the Mineral Resources Account as well as the intended use for funds deposited in said account; and

WHEREAS, the Supervisors of the Town of Lynne believe that the level of disturbance to their residents, businesses, and infrastructure, justifies the use of Mineral Resource Account funds to develop public works projects within the their town; and

WHEREAS, the Forestry, Land, and Outdoor Recreation Committee has received **a** written request from the Supervisors of the Town of Lynne for \$17,500 to be taken from the Mineral Resources Account to construct a public park pavilion on lands owned by the Town of Lynne, near the present Town

Hall and Fire Station off of Willow RD and Flowage RD, being located in the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ - NW $\frac{1}{4}$ and the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ - SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 10, Township 37 North Range 4 East.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Forestry, Land, and Outdoor Recreation Committee unanimously voted 5-0 to forward the request from the Town of Lynne to the Oneida County Board of Supervisors with the recommendation that \$17,500 be withdrawn from the Mineral Resources Account and granted to the Town of Lynne to fund the construction of a public park pavilion on lands owned by the Town of Lynne, near the present Town Hall and Fire Station off of Willow RD and Flowage RD, being located in the SW¼ - NW¼ and the NW¼ - SW¼ of Section 10, Township 37 North Range 4 East.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the above-described park pavilion shall be managed and maintained by the Town of Lynne as a public facility; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, by the Oneida County Board of Supervisors that the county budget for fiscal year 2010 shall be amended to meet all projected costs as set forth above.
