Weather Alert Radio Set-Up Procedures MAXON WX-80

Battery Installation

A standard square nine-volt battery is used to provide back-up power to the Weather Alert Radio. The battery compartment is located in the bottom of the radio. **DO NOT USE RECHARGEABLE BATTERIES.**

Programming The Radio

- Push and hold the **OFF** button until the radio beeps
- Type in the number **2**, this is the frequency for Oneida County.
- Press the **YES** button to save the change
- Push and hold the **OFF** button until the radio beeps to return back to the alert mode.

Programming Voice Alert

- Push and hold down the **OFF** button until the radio beeps.
- Press the **YES** button
- Press the **NO** button, this changes the Alert Mode to the Voice Mode
- Press the **YES** button to save the change
- Push and hold the **OFF** button until the radio beeps to return to the alert mode.

Programming Specific County Information

- Push and hold the **OFF** button until the radio beeps
- Press the **YES** button three times until it displays the single option on the display.
- Press the **NO** button to switch to multiple option.
- Press the **YES** button to select multiple option.
- Press the **NO** button and enter the appropriate code (County FIPS codes are listed below)
- Press the **YES** button to save the change and enter the next code.
- Repeat the two previous steps to enter additional codes.
- Push and hold the **OFF** button to return back to the alert mode.
