DISC GOLF RULES AND REGULATIONS

Disc Golf is played like ball golf, using flying discs instead of balls. One stroke is counted each time the disc is thrown and when a penalty is incurred. The winner is the player with the lowest score.

Tee throws must be completed within the designated tee areas.

After teeing off, the player whose disc is farthest from the hole always throws first. The player with the fewest throws on the previous hole is the first to tee off on the next hole.

Fairway throws must be made with the foot closest to the hole on the spot where the last throw came to rest. The other foot may be no closer to the hole than the foot on this lie.

A run-up and normal follow through after release is allowed more than 10 yards from the hole. Inside of 10 yards, the player is not allowed to step past his or her lie.

A disc that comes to rest inside of the basket constitutes successful completion of the hole.

Assure the safety of other players by patiently waiting your turn.

Be alert and courteous to other park users.

Help protect our natural areas by picking up litter and not harming the native vegetation.
