1. Call to Order:

The regular meeting of the Criminal Justice Coordinating Committee (CJCC) was brought to order at 12:01 p.m. by Mr. Steven Schreier, Chairperson. The Chairperson noted that the meeting had been properly posted and mailed in accordance with the Wisconsin Open Meeting Laws.

2. Approval of Agenda:

Motion by Mr. Tyler Young, seconded by Mr. Tom Kelly to approve the agenda as posted. All ayes; motion carried.

3. Review of Minutes from June 8, 2023 CJCC Meeting:

Motion by Mr. Tyler Young, seconded by Tom Kelly to approved the June 8, 2023 minutes as presented. All ayes; motion carried.

4. Harms Reduction Strategies – Jenny Chiamulera, Public Health:

Ms. Jenny Chiamulera presented Harms Reduction Strategies in Oneida County. They will be doing a Fentanyl campaign in our community. The health department will be doing radio ads for 4 weeks on different radio stations. They have \$1500 in funding for the ads. They are also looking at doing ads on billboards which they will need funding for as well as press releases and social media. Ms. Tamara Feest stated the Human Service Center would have some prevention dollars to help with the billboard cost.

There was discussion on the ability to provide Fentanyl test strips and Narcan to the public. Need to find out about liability. Ms. Carissa Hoefler stated that people on supervision do have access to Narcan and Fentanyl test strips.

We need to educate the general public on Fentanyl as well as the user population. We currently use the Recovery Coaches to educate people. Maybe get some posters put up in Social Services to help educate people as well as the billboards and radio ads.

We need to figure out as a county and how to grow in this area.

Motion by Mr. Steven Schreier, seconded by Mr. Tom Kelly to designate \$2500.00 for the Fentanyl campaign to be used for the remainder of this year and will be forwarded to the Public Safety Committee. All ayes; motion carried.

5. **Fentanyl Awareness Campaign and request to use designated ARPA funds:**
Combined with number four above.

6. **GAP Analysis “wish list” review and discussion:**

Mr. Jamie Kiener reported that the GAP Analysis will be postponed until the September meeting.

7. **Reports – Treatment Alternative and Diversion Funding in State Budget:** Ms. Mary Rideout reported that the Joint Finance Committee - Omnibus Motion 93 – Department of Justice approved the following:

7.c. Provide \$1,000,000 GPR in 2024-25 to expand the Treatment Alternatives and Diversion (TAD Program).

Victim Witness Services: 10. County Victim Witness Program. Adopt Alternative A2a to provide \$1,503,400 GPR in 2023-24 and \$1,901,400 in 2024-25 to increase the reimbursement provided to county victim witness offices to an estimated 60 percent of county costs.

8. **Training Opportunities – Wisconsin Substance Use Prevention Conference:**
Ms. Mary Rideout shared training opportunities related to substance abuse. These are open to all members of the CJCC and potentially could be funded through ARPA dollars. If interested please email Mary Rideout and she will start a list of people interested in attending.

9. **Budget and Program Reports:**

Ms. Mary Rideout reviewed the Budget Report and also provided the Committee with a Map of Wisconsin Counties and Tribes with Treatment Alternatives and Diversion (TAD) Funding Programs.


