**1. Call to Order:**

The regular meeting of the Criminal Justice Coordinating Committee (CJCC) was brought to order at 12:00 p.m. by Mr. Steven Schreier, Chairperson. The Chairperson noted that the meeting had been properly posted and mailed in accordance with the Wisconsin Open Meeting Laws.

**2. Approval of Agenda:**

Motion by Mr. Lloyd Gauthier, seconded by Ms. Breanna Magallones to approve the agenda as posted. All ayes; motion carried.

**3. Review of Minutes from January 24, 2023 CJCC Meeting:**

Motion by Mr. Tom Kelly, seconded by Ms. Breanna Magallones to approved the January 24, 2023 minutes as presented. All ayes; motion carried.

**4. Announcement of new community Liaisons:**

Introductions of Ms. Kate Ferrel the President of Nicolet College will be the Representative from Higher Education and Mother Meredyth Albright from St. Augustine's Church will be the Ministry Representative. Both being non-voting members.

**5. Social Services Positive/Negative Substances Report 2022:**

Ms. Mary Rideout discussed the Positive/Negative Report from Forensic Fluids Laboratories that show the number of positive/negative drug test results and what

the total positives for specific drugs. Oneida County has a high positivity rate per Forensic Fluids. The use of Fentanyl is trending upward. Tyler Young from the Sheriff's Office states that these numbers follow suit with the Sheriff's Department.

**6. ARPA Funding Estimated Budget – Discuss Potential Uses:**

Ms. Mary Rideout explained the TAD Grant Funding as of January 31, 2023. We may have the grant for the next four years. In 2024 once the program is up and running we will request the maximum amount. Once the grant match is met with the APRA dollars, there will be approximately \$38,032 that this group will have to decide what to do with it. Ms. Rideout would like to do a Fentanyl campaign so everyone in Oneida County knows about Fentanyl. Ms. Rideout explained that there seems to be a lack of public awareness about Fentanyl and she feels we need to address the issue before it becomes the most prevalent substance we see.

**7. Treatment Alternative and Diversion Program (TAD) Grant Update, determining Sub-Committee and introduction of Diversion Program Coordinator:**

- The committee determined the sub-committee members being: Ms. Mary Rideout, Assistant District Attorney Mary Sowinski, Attorney Breanna Magallones, and Ms. Brenda Lee. The sub-committee will meet more regularly in the beginning but once up and running can probably meet quarterly.
- Justice Point has hired Ms. Trisha Moore who is the Program Coordinator. They will be hiring Case Managers for both Vilas and Oneida Counties.

**8. Office Space Needed for Diversion Program:**

Office space is needed for the Diversion Program. This office will need to accommodate two people and preferably in the Court House.

**9. Opioid Settlement Funds – Requirements and Recommendations:**

Ms. Mary Rideout discussed Exhibit E – List of Opioid Remediation Uses. This covers a broad range of uses. This group needs to make recommendations on how to use these funds. We do not have a deadline to spend these funds as they will trickle in for approximately the next 18 years.

There will be a Restorative Justice presentation on March 24, 2024 in Judge Burns Court Room.

Discussion on the Andrew Center and if they will have resources available to help counties. And if it would be appropriate to use these funds. Would have to look into if Opioid Settlement dollars could be used.

One option could be to connect with other counties and do something regional.

**10. Mapping Session – March 17, 2023 – 1:00 p.m. – 3:00 p.m.:**

The mapping session will be held on March 17, 2023 from 1:00 p.m. to 3:00 p.m. in Committee Room II. Information will be coming out to committee members.

**11. Operating While Intoxicated (OWI) Court Update:**

Ms. Mary Rideout connected with Sarah Wang from Sirona Recovery and they are not a licensed AODA provider yet but they are working on it.

Ms. Jillian Gellings with Koller will be a Community Liaison with the CJCC. Rideout will discuss needs around substance use counseling with Ms. Gellings.

**12. Coordinated Community Response Team:**

Assistant District Attorney Mary Sowinski explained that this group used to meet quarterly and consisted of many people that are part of the CJCC. ADA Mary Sowinski suggested that this group be part of the CJCC and a sub-committee.

**13. Public Comment:**


