3 **Resolution to create an ADA drop-off at door #1 of the Oneida County Courthouse**

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5 Resolution approved for presentation to the Oneida County Board by the Supervisors of the
6 Administration Committee

8 Resolved by the Board of Supervisors of Oneida County, Wisconsin:

10 **WHEREAS**, the Oneida County Board of Supervisors approved resolution #54-2017
11 directing to the Buildings and Grounds (County Facilities) Committee to plan and implement a
12 single point of entry to the Oneida County Courthouse ; and,

13
14 **WHEREAS**, in March 2018, the County Facilities Committee hired Venture Architects to
15 complete a feasibility study regarding a single point secure entrance to the existing Historical
16 Oneida County Courthouse; and,

17
18 **WHEREAS**, the County Facilities Committee approved the single point of entry at door #1 of
19 the Oneida County Courthouse limits ADA access at that entrance; and,

20
21 **WHEREAS**, the nearest handicap parking is located in the north and south parking lots of
22 the Courthouse, approximately 120 feet from door #1; and,

23
24 **WHEREAS**, the creation of an ADA drop-off would significantly benefit individuals with
25 mobility limitations allowing for easier and safer access to the Courthouse; and,

26
27 **WHEREAS**, the Courthouse Single Point of Entry and Elevator Feasibility Study conducted
28 by Venture Architects in June 2018 notes an ADA drop-off can be constructed in front of the
29 Courthouse along Oneida Avenue and would follow the existing sidewalk around the landscape
30 islands and the sculpture; and

32 **WHEREAS**, the Buildings and Grounds Department has provided an estimated project
33 budget not to exceed \$75,000 to create an ADA drop-off at door #1.

35 **THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, by the Oneida County Board of Supervisors that the
36 Buildings and Grounds department is hereby authorized to create an ADA drop-off at door #1 of
37 the Oneida County Courthouse; and,

39 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that funding for the ADA drop-off will be funded by
40 Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Fund (SLFRF) or general fund not to exceed
41 \$75,000.




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
